Just two years after his surprise box office smash, Oscarwinning *Slumdog Millionaire* director Danny Boyle takes a different tack, adapting canyoneer Aron Ralston's harrowing true-life account of the 127 hours he spent trapped in a narrow cave. With a tour-de-force performance from James Franco and an imaginative shooting style that relies on two cameras and inventive angles, what could have been static and deadly dull comes blazingly to life in this powerful and compelling story of one man's will to survive. A youthful, adventurous audience is most likely to turn this into a sizable hit. Though it's doubtful it

will reach *Slumdog* heights, Fox Searchlight won't be complaining. Boyle's on to something fresh here.

Pete Hammond says ... After directing big crowd pleasers like *The Bourne Identity* and Mr. and Mrs. Smith, Doug Liman takes a 180 degree turn in the politically explosive thriller, Fair Game. The film is based on the real life scandal of CIA operative Valerie Plame. Bush Administration officials leaked the agent's identity to a prominent D.C. columnist in retaliation for a New York *Times* article her Ambassador husband wrote disputing the existence of weapons of mass destruction in Iraq. With first-rate performances from Sean Penn and Naomi Watts and a compelling script, this suspenseful, taut drama should keep audiences nailed to their seats when it's released this fall. Debuting in competition at the Cannes Film Festival, a respectable box office haul, critical support and awards talk should make

this an exception to the recent weak track record for fact-based political dramas like *State Of Play.*

Budding Aussie actor Ryan Kwanten (The Legend of the Guardians: Owls of Ga'hoole) stars as Shane Cooper, a city cop who takes a job in the country to comfort the anxieties of his pregnant wife. The escape of a convict, an aborigine associated with the town's tenuously designated nature preserve, sets the local police on high alert...but they conspicuously refuse backup. Red Hill asks what it means to be a man (as opposed to a monster). Still, the film has a commercial sensibility that makes it accessible and espouses values that are a welcome throwback to the genre, thus making it a fetching find for its distributor and a great option

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
